Garrison's appearance at a party given for state Sen. Nat G. Kiefer and state Rep.-Elect Charles Borrello was a surprise as the DA has been little seen since he began suffering from a serious back ailment in 1969 that has required surgery and constant treat-

Appearing fit and in an a m i a ble, gregarious mood, Garrison told well-wishers that he had been seriously ill,

saying to one group that he had been "close to the grave." He said that he now feels he is well on his way to regaining his health.

The three-term DA, who became an international figure for his unsuccessful prosecution of Clay Shaw in the President Kennedy assassination

case, has been indicted by federal grand juries for gamibling, public bribery and income tax evasion.

He has denied all charge, and his attorneys have sought without success to date to have the charges dropped on technical grounds.
