

U.S. Is Asked by Indonesia To Delay Aid to Cambodia

JAKARTA, Indonesia, April 29 (UPI) — Foreign Minister Adam Malik urged the United States today not to send arms or military aid to Cambodia while Indonesia was arranging a conference to try to guarantee Cambodia's neutrality.

The request was submitted to Francis J. Galbraith, the United States Ambassador, during a meeting at Mr. Malik's house. Mr. Malik made his request following reports that a United States Air Force plane unloaded big wooden crates at Pnompenh airport on Monday.

Mr. Malik said Mr. Galbraith told him that the crates had contained "communication equipment" for the United States Embassy in the Cambodian capital.

Mr. Malik said preparations for the 20 Asian and Pacific countries conference in Jakarta, tentatively scheduled for May 11 and 12, were proceeding smoothly.
