The White House communications director, Herbert G. Klein, said he and Gov. Raymond P. Shafer of Pennsylvania had made the trip and met with Premier Lon Nol and the United States chargé d'affaires, Lloyd M. Rives. He declined to disclose what the discussions involved.

The fact-finding group of Senators, Representaitves, Governors and White House aides left this afternoon for Hawaii after a four-day visit to Vietnam and Cambodia.

LOS ANGELES, June 8 (Reuters) — A member of President Nixon's fact-finding mission said today that he believed the United States or South Vietnam should be flexible enough to go back into the Cambodian sanctuary areas again if the Communists tried to rebuild their bases there. Senator John C. Tower of Texas, who flew back to the United States ahead of the rest of the mission, said he believed the Communists had been set back for much more than six months by the drive into Cambodia.
