## Mrs. Binh Indicates Vietcong Might Deal With 'Big Minh'

PARIS, Nov. 2—Mrs. Nguyen Thi Binh, chief negotiator for the Vietcong at the Vietnam peace talks here, indicated today that her side might be prepared to deal with a South Vietnamese government headed by Gen. Duong Van Minh.

Mrs. Binh, who returned here today from a visit to London, was asked by newsmen what she thought of the appeal for reconciliation made yesterday in Saigon by the general, who is popularly known as "Big Minh."

"As we have already said," Mrs. Binh, who is foreign minister of the Vietcong's provisional revolutionary government, replied, "We are ready to make contact with any person, except Thieu, Ky and Khiem, provided that the person is for peace, independence, neutrality and democracy, with a view to discussing the problems of the cessation of the war and the formation of a coalition government—that is to say, all the problems concerning the guarantee to the South Vietnamese people of their right to self-determination."
