"As we have already said," Mrs. Binh, who is foreign min-ister of the Vietcong's pro-visional revolutionary govern-ment, replied, "We are ready to make contact with any per-son, except Thieu, Ky and Khiem, provided that the per-son is for peace, independence. son is for peace, independence, neutrality and democracy, with a view to discussing the prob-lems of the cessation of the war and the formation of a coalition government—that is to say, all the problems concerning the guarantee to the South Vietnamese people of their right to self-determina-tion."
