Ky Due Next Week on Delayed Visit

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (AP)—State Department officials said today that Vice President Nguyen Cao Ky of South Vietnam would visit the United States next week. For security reasons, the time and place of his arrival were not disclosed.

Mr. Ky, after inspecting South Vietnamese officers and airmen being trained in this country, will meet President Nixon at the White House on Nov. 23 or 24, sources said.

Mr. Ky was dissuaded from visiting the United States before the Nov. 3 elections.

Members of both the Saigon Government and the United States Congress took the position that his appearance here at an October March for Victory, a right-wing rally organized by the Rev. Carl T. McIntire, would not be desirable.

The Nixon Administration maintained a frosty silence on the visit at that time until recurring reports that Mr. Ky would come anyway brought a

statement from Vice President Agnew opposing the visit.

It was understood that on his trip here. Mr. Ky will address the National Press Club here and make television appearances.

Elaborate security precautions are being prepared for Mr. Ky, a favorite target of anti-war demonstrators.

When the McIntire rally was scheduled, various organizations announced plans to hold a counterrally nearby.

Mr. Ky is expected to visit Lackland Air Force Base in Texas; Fort Leavenworth, Kan.; Hunter Air Force Base, Ga., and Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala.

He is also expected to visit South Vietnamese naval officers training at the naval base at Newport, R.I.

He has been invited to address the Commonwealth Club in San Francisco and to stop over in Los Angeles on his way home to Saigon.
