Some Antiaircraft Fire

SAIGON, Wednesday, Sept. 22 (AP)—Pilots reported light to moderate antiaircraft fire during their raids on North Vietnam yesterday but said they had encountered no surface-to-air missiles.

In South Vietnam, only scant and scattered action was reported yesterday. Fighting subsided in the U Minh Forest, 145 miles southwest of Saigon, after a week of repeated clashes.

For the first time in more than a month, there were no United States B-52 bomber raids reported in South Vietnam. The bombers struck in Laos and Cambodia, the United States Command said. The last time a day passed without B-52 strikes in South Vietnam was Aug. 12.

In the Central Highlands, enemy gunners fired five rockets into a United States military compound near Pleiku yesterday in a rare daytime shelling. At least one American was killed and several were wounded.
