

Congressmen--N. Viets' meeting ends in anger

SAIGON — A meeting between members of the U.S. Congress and the North Vietnamese delegation here ended today in a heated verbal exchange.

One congressman told the Hanoi representatives their attitude had convinced him to vote for U.S. supplemental military aid for South Vietnam.

Another member of the U.S. delegation told the North Vietnamese that their replies to questions about Americans missing in action were hogwash.

His voice raised, Rep. William Chappel Jr. (D-Fla.) told Lt. Col. Nguyen Duc Bao, acting chief of the North Vietnamese delegation:

"I came as other mem-

bers of this delegation did to South Vietnam with as much objectivity as I know how to perform and exercise," and that he had hoped what they had learned would give them an opportunity to foster peace in Southeast Asia.

Chapel told a newsman he had come here with an open mind, but that the North Vietnamese response had convinced him to vote for the \$300 million in supplementary military aid requested by the Ford administration for South Vietnam.
