**VIETCONG AIDE PUTS
POLITICAL AIM FIRST**

PARIS, April 10 (AP)—The foreign minister of the Communists' Provisional Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam said today that he Vietcong were trying to obtain their objectives "if possible by other than military means."

Mrs. Ngyen Thi Binh, the foreign minister, said in an interview with the newspaper Le Monde that the "use of

force, the use of military means, depends entirely on the opponent."

Speaking in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, with a correspondent of the newspaper during a tour of African capitals, she described the situation in South Vietnam as "irreversible." She repeated the Vietcong's demand for the ouster of President Nguyen Van Thieu before any political negotiations could take place, and added that "if there is a change in Saigon without a change of policy, that will be useless."
