President of Cambodia In Hawaii for Therapy

HONOLULU, April II (AP)

—President Lop Nol of Cambodia arrived here last night following 10 days on the island of Bali in Indonesia.

He left Cambodia April 1, saying he hoped his departure saying he hoped his departure could lead to a negotiated settlement with the insurgents.

The President is expected to check in at Tripler Army

to check in at Tripler Army Hospital today for medical therapy similar to that which he received at the same hospital after suffering a stroke in 1971.

On hand to great him were Adm. Noel Gayler, the American Pacific commander, and Gen. Louis L. Wilson, com-mander of United States Pacific Air Forces.

The traditional Hawaiian greetings usually accorded visiting dignitaries were dis-pensed with and Marshal Lon Nol and his party went straight to five cars that were escorted to quarters on the Hickam Air Force Base.

The Uinted States Government is paying for his stay in Hawaii, and the State Department is handling all details, a military spokesman said.
