

No Flights of Children From Vietnam Listed

SAN FRANCISCO, April 14
(UPI) — "Operation Babylift" ended today.

"They are closing up shop. We have no word of more flights" carrying homeless children to the United States from South Vietnam, an Army spokesman said.

A total of 980 Vietnamese children were processed through the center on their way to homes with American families.

Green military blankets, mattresses, white sheets and cartons of medical supplies were set aside for use in the event the Saigon Government permits more homeless children to be evacuated, the spokesman said.

Approximately 50 children remain in area hospitals for treatment of various illnesses before they are sent on to their adoptive parents, the spokesman said.

Maria Eitz, an official for Friends of All Children, the Boulder, Colo., adoption agency that sponsored most of the flights, said over the weekend some of the refugees "may have been replaced on the planes by children from families that had money."
