***Flying Tiger Flies
Employees to Guam***

AGANA, Guam, April 21
—A Flying Tiger cargo jet
loaded with about 100 com-
pany employees—many of

them Vietnamese—left Sai-
gon early today and flew
unexpectedly to Guam with-
out going through any immi-
gration checks.

Gary Kangeiser, the com-
pany's Saigon manager who
accompanied the refugees,
said most of the employees
would have been on Viet-
cong extermination lists.

One American aboard the
flight said he left because of
"increasing frustration with
the way American officials
were handling the immigra-
tion" and the fear that he
and his Vietnamese wife
might not be allowed out.

The government of Guam
has assumed responsibility
for the refugees since the
U.S. State Department and
Immigration Service have
refused to acknowledge the
presence of the immigrants.

Last week the Guam terri-
torial legislature approved a
resolution offering the is-
land as a haven for refu-
gees.
