

Refugee aid asked of State

SACRAMENTO — Gov. Brown was asked yesterday to make \$100,000 available to set up temporary facilities for Vietnamese refugees arriving in California.

Mario Obledo, secretary of Health and Welfare, said the federal government asked the state to provide money and disclosed Californians

might be asked to provide temporary homes for the refugees.

Obledo said Brown wanted more information before he releases the funds under emergency provisions of the state budget.

State Department officials reported California eventually would be reimbursed.
