

More Viet Kids Land Here

Another 202 children from war-wracked Indochina arrived at the Presidio of San Francisco yesterday — this group for brief processing before continuing on to Denmark.

The children, flown out of Saigon airport on a World Airways plane, are orphans of Montagnard tribesmen and are sponsored by a Danish relief organization, Children Protective and Security International.

World Airways said the children, aged 4 to 14, are to stay in Denmark until Vietnam is stabilized and they

can return to their own country.

This was the first known evacuation of Montagnard children, the Montagnards live in the hills of Vietnam and most have never recognized the governments of either North or South Vietnam.

After medical processing at the Presidio, the children were moved yesterday afternoon to Ft. Cronkhite.

"The facilities are better for them there," a Presidio spokesman said.

Meanwhile, Army doctors

announced they are providing "precautionary shots" for volunteers who helped care for previous refugee children.

No dangerous contagious diseases were reported among the children but many volunteers suffered painful diarrhea. The inoculations being offered are immune serum globulin, which doctors said provides "a degree of resistance to hepatitis."

Shots today will be available from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the immunization clinic at Letterman Army Medical Center.
