Red Cross Asserts It Wants to Continue Activities in Vietnam

GENEVA, April 30—The International Committee of the Red Cross said today that it hoped to continue without interruption the humanitarian activity it had been conducting in South Vietnam from Saigon.

Roger Gallopin, the committee's chief executive officer, said the agency's principal representative in Saigon, Pierre Guberan, had been instructed to contact the new authorities in Saigon to insure that the

work can continue.

The radio transmitter of the seven-man Red Cross team in Saigon continued to function after the capital's capitulation to the Provisional Revolutionary Government, Mr. Gallopin said at a news conference. Radio contact has been maintained between the Saigon team and the relay transmitter that the committee has in Bangkok, Thailand, he said.

Mr. Gallopin stressed that the committee had to cooperate with whatever authority was in control of an area where there was a humanitarian task

to be performed.
