Saigon Red to Move

Into Embassy in Paris

PARIS., May 6 (AP)—A representative of the South Vietnamese Revolutionary Government has taken over the Paris embassy from the old regime, a spokesman said today.

The insurgents had been represented in Paris since 1968 by a delegation to the peace talks. After the Paris cease-fire agreement of 1972, a permanent mission was established here, but the French Government did not give the Provisional Revolutionary Government formal diplomatic recognition.

The spokesman said that the permanent mission would remain in its present location in suburban Neuilly until the old embassy building had been renovated. He said no decision had been made on applying to the French Government to have the mission elevated to embassy status.

Pham Van Ba, who has the personal rank of ambassador, has headed the permanent mission here.
