

Saigon

International communications were restored yesterday by the new government of South Vietnam following a weeklong blackout after the takeover of Saigon April 30.

The city was back to normal with major hotels, including the Caravelle and the Continental, functioning, the markets open and no restrictions on the movements of more than 100 foreign newsmen.

Between April 29 and the resumption of communications the only reports of events in Saigon had come from radio broadcasts monitored in countries bordering South Vietnam.
