From story by David A. Andelman, NYT 13 Jun 75, datelined Bangkok:

"At least a dozen participants in × the march have managed to break away and make their way to the Thai-Cambodian border in the last two weeks In interviews with Western and Thai intelligence officers ... they described life in Cambodia following the capture of Phnom Penh by Communist forces on April 16.... Enough food, particularly tice, had been stored [by the Khmer Rouge] at various points along the line of march to feed the millions who had taken to the highways. This was confirmed by the Western journalists who had left in the caravan from Phnom Penh and took a similar toute in trucks to theThai border The refugees who were interviewed said that they had been well treated and never wanted for basic food, principally rice. And they said they had never seen evidence of brutality on the part of the communist officers.....
