Nearly 200 Vetnamese 7ch ugees were flown from two United States relocation centers yesterday to new lives in Canada, according to The Associated Press.

Thirty-five refugees were picked up by an Air Canada jetliner at Eglin Air Force Base in Florida and 161 from a center at Fort Chaffee, Ark., joined them during a stopover of the Montreal-bound flight at Little Rock Ark.
