CAMBODIANS DEFEAT SOLDIERS AT SHRINE MAY 24 1975 BANGKOK, Thailand, May 23

BANGKOK, Thailand May 23 (UPI) — Communist troops have overpowered the last known anti-Communist holdouts in Cambodia, storming a Buddhist shrine on a cliff along the Thai border.

Thai officials said today that the Communist forces had bombarded the Preah Vihar temple with heavy artillery and then scaled the 1,500-foot cliff to drive out about 30 soldiers who had refused to surrender.

The Communists made several unsuccessful assaults against the holdouts since the collapse of the United States-backed Cambodian Government on April 17.

April 17. Thai officials reported that about 100 Communist soldiers attacked early yesterday and sized the temple by the end of the uay.

the uay. The 1,000-year-old shrine is astride the Thai-Cambodian border about 300 miles northeast of Bangkok.
