Coalition Government Urged at Lower Levels

VIENTIANE, June 5 (AP) — Laos' coalition Cabinet proposed today that both the pro-Communist Pathet Lao and the non-Communist faction of neutralists and rightists be represented in local governments throughout the kingdom, a government spokesman said.

Details of the plan were not available, but it would apparently give the non-Communist side of the coalition an official standing in the large part of the country that has been under control of the Communist Pathet Lao for years.

The Laotian Cabinet spokesman, Ouday Souvannouvong, said the proposal would be sent to Prince Souphanouvong, nominal head of the Pathet Lao, which has gained all but complete dominance in Laos in the last month.

Under the plan, Ouday said, a province with a Communist governor would have a non-Communist deputy, and viceversa.
