BANGKOK, Thailand, June 8 The North Vietnamese National Assembly urged today that Hanoi eventually be made the capital of a reunified Viet-

The statement was in a report of the first meeting of the fifth session of the National Assembly, which ended Friday. It was broadcast over the Hanoi radio and monitered here.

"The National Assembly hopes that people in Hanoi will develop the revolutionary tradition to establish Hanoi as the capital of the entire country," the report said.

Leaders Are Re-Elected

"The people in the capital are on the threshold of a new history that requires new efforts in response to the heavier and larger responsibilities toward South Vietnam and Saigon," it said.
