U.S. CONSUL VISITS WOMAN HELD IN LAOS

VIENTIANE, Laos, June 11 (AP)—An American woman imprisoned by the Pathet Lao for eight days was visited today by the United States Consul, a doctor and officials of the Laotian Foreign Ministry, an American official said.

Results of the visit were not immediately known.

Rosemary Conway, 36 years old, of Chicago and Las Vegas, a former teacher at the international school here is being held on what United States officials called "unspecified political charges." The United States Embassy is still trying to get an official explanation for her detention.

Miss Conway was arrested June 4 returning from a dinner date with a Laotian Air Force pilot and she has been held since then in a dingy police station.

According to Laotian law, a person can be held only 72 hours without being charged. But a United States official said, "The Pathet Lao make their own laws."

Meanwhile, the United States Embassy said that only 107 American officials were still in the country and that more were expected to leave on scheduled flights before the end of the day. Officials said that after the mission of the United States Agency for International Development closes June 30 the embassy will probably be left with only about 50 American staff members.
