4 Americans Held on Base

To Face Charges by Thais NYTimes BANCKOK, Thailand, June 13 (AP)—A United States Army provost marshal and three military policemen are in army custody at a base in northeastern Thailand pending disposition of Thai charges that they as-saulted and illegally held a former Thai employe of the en-

listed men's clug on the base.
United States military authorities said that no date had been set for a trial. Few American servicemen ever come to trial in Thai courts because most cases are settled out of

The authorities said that the four men had been assigned temporarily to nonmilitary-police duties at Ramasun Station, a secret "radio research" facility 250 miles northeast of Bangkok and that their passes to leave the base had been lifted.

The four, Capt. Ronald P. Face of Leesville, La.; Sgt. 1.C. Ralph I. Faulkner; Sgt. Wayne Cooper of Cranford, N. J., and Sgt. Cecil A. Jolly Jr. of Texas City, Tex., were arrested Feb. In connection with an incident that took place Jan. 27.
