**CAMBODIANS' PLIGHT
BRINGS INQUIRY CALL**

The Freedom House called yesterday for an international investigation into the plight of more than three million Cambodians forced by the Communists to flee cities into the countryside last April.

The chairman, Leo Chérne urged the United Nations and the International Red Cross to take steps immediately to find out the plight of these people. "It is one of the greatest tragedies of modern time," he declared.

He compared it to the death of six million Jews and three million non-Jews under the Nazis in World War II.

Freedom House is a private non profit organization established in 1940 in response to Hitler's Munich Braunhaus, the ideological center of Nazi theory and propaganda. Freedom House gives its views on doctrines and movements it considers opposed to dignity and
