

'Cambodia Toll'

Atlanta

Cambodia has suffered a "terrible toll" of death under communist control, Secretary of State Henry Kissinger said yesterday.

"We know much less of what is happening in Cambodia than we did before," Kissinger told a news conference. "We do know that there has been a rather terrible toll of civilians that

was inflicted on the Cambodian people when all the populations of all the towns were evacuated."

Kissinger said he has reports of clashes between South Vietnam and Cambodia. He said that fighting has been reported on their borders and on islands including one near where the American freighter Mayaguez was captured by the Cambodians.

Kissinger's news conference ended an overnight visit to Atlanta where he made a speech in his latest appearance to discuss foreign affairs with citizens in what he called "The American Heartland." So pleased were his Georgian hosts that Governor George D. Busbee made him a colonel in the Georgia militia.
