

THAILAND'S PREMIER ON HIS WAY TO CHINA

HONG KONG, June 29 — Premier Kukrit Pramoj of Thailand, on his way to China to establish diplomatic relations, said here today that he realized that the Chinese would continue to give moral support and encouragement to Thai insurgents.

Premier Kukrit disclosed that, as in the case of Malaysia and the Philippines, the Chinese had agreed not to interfere in the internal affairs of Thailand. However, he added, the Thai Government realized that the Chinese would continue to express support for Thai revolutionaries.

"It does not concern us very much," the Premier said at an airport news conference. "I don't think there is a very strong Communist party in my country." He is scheduled to continue his trip tomorrow.

The Malaysian Prime Minister, Abdul Razak, recently protested to Peking over a congratulatory message that the Chinese sent to the Malayan Communist party. He warned that relations between the two governments could not remain cordial if China continued to support the guerrillas who have stepped up their activities in recent months.
