MOSCOW, Aug. 18 (UPI)—
Premier Alexei Kosygin told
visiting U.S. presidential candidate Terry Sanford today
that he feels the Vietnamese
would be responsible to a
"proper approach" by the
United States about men missing in action in Indochina.

Sanford, former governor of North Carolina and an announced candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1976, said Kosygin hinted that there might be some counterdemand on the part of the Vietnamese if they permitted American search teams to visit North Vietnam to search for the bodies of missing men.

One possible concession cited by Kosygin an an illustration might be American approval of Vietnamese membership in the United Nations, Sanford said. The United States vetoed membership for North and South Vietnam when the U.N. Security Council voted on the issue Aug. 11.
