

## **South Vietnam Revives Mail Service Abroad**

SAIGON, South Vietnam, Sept. 8 (UPI)—The General Post Office announced Monday that it would accept ordinary overseas air and surface mail to any point in the world.

The announcement signaled the end of disruption of mail service since the Communist Government came to power April 30.

Foreign mail will be routed through China, East Germany and Czechoslovakia, the announcement said. Registered mail still will not be accepted.

In another development, the Provisional Revolutionary Government said that at least 82 countries had established diplomatic relations with South Vietnam.

The United States Postal Service said over the weekend that mail service to South Vietnam had been suspended again because it refused to accept dispatches from the United States. Mail for South Vietnam will be returned to the sender.
