The commissioner, Prince Sadruddin Aga Khan, said he had agreed to fly the group from Hanoi in response to a request from the South Vietnamese Government.

The evacuation is expected to take place at the end of the month or at the start of No-vember.

United Nations officials believe about 20 persons are in-volved. Most of them are thought to be American mis-sionaries. There are also a few

Australians and Canadians and possibly others.
