A newborn Cambodian boy and his parents became the last of the Southeast Asian war refugees in camp as the biggest United States relocation center folded its tents yesterday.

The unnamed boy was born in the Naval Hospital late Wednesday, a Marine Corps spokesman said. His parents were expected to remain five days.

Meanwhile, the last 147 refugees seeking new lives in the United States left, one by one or in small groups, as their sponsors arrived.
