Quakers Can Send Aid

Washington

The American Friends Service Committee said yesterday the government has reversed itself and allowed the Quaker relief group to send all the humanitarian aid it wants to Vietnam.

In July the administration

denied export licenses for shipment of the aid, totaling more than \$200,000 worth of such items as acrylic yarn for sweaters, fishnets, agricultural implements and wood screw-making machines.

The Quakers, although denied the licenses, had said they would

go ahead and ship the material. They announced last week that the first shipment of yarn for children's sweaters, had already arrived in the North Vietnamese port of Haiphong.
