Two aides to Senator Edward Kennedy (Dem-Mass.) arrived yesterday en route to Saigon to pick up the remains of the last two U.S. servicemen killed in the Vietnam war, diplomatic sources said.

The two aides, Jerry Tinker and Dale Dehaan, are scheduled to fly to the South Vietnamese capital tomorrow aboard a plane chartered by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees and return to Bangkok the same day, according to the sources. The two U.S. Marines — Corporal Charles McMahon Jr. of Woburn, Mass., and Lance Corporal Darwin L. Judge of Marshalltown, Iowa — were killed by a rocket while loading passengers on evacuation aircraft at the Saigon airport April 29, 1975, just before the Communists took the city.
