

SESSION IN PARIS CANCELED BY REDS

Hanoi and Vietcong Protest

U.S. Bombing of North

PARIS, May 6—North Vietnam and the Vietcong today called off the 66th plenary session of the Vietnam peace talks almost at the last moment.

The extraordinary move was described by North Vietnam's spokesman, Nguyen Than Le, as "a political decision" to protest the renewed United States bombing of his country's territory over five days. He said the session was put back to May 14 but made it clear that that, too, could be called off.

"If the Nixon Administration continues its bombing against the territory of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, it must bear the entire responsibility for all the grave consequences arising from its acts," the delegation said in a formal statement.

The May 14 date was not immediately accepted by the United States and by Vietnam, whose delegation indicated in particular prepared
