

# The Whole of Haverford in D.C. Protest

## Philadelphia

Everybody at Haverford College is going to Washington for a day to protest the war in Southeast Asia. And that includes the janitors.

More than 675 students, faculty members, administrators, secretaries and maintenance men from the small Quaker liberal arts college — plus 50 girls from neighboring Bryn Mawr — will transfer operations from Philadelphia to the nation's capital in 15 buses today.

"It is neither a strike nor business as usual," says Dr. John R. Coleman, president of the all-male school.

"I feel reasonably certain that the school will show that these are not 'bums' but concerned students who are expressing their opinions in a positive way."

The group plans to hold eight seminars, one of them in the House Small Business Committee room of the Sam Rayburn House Office Building.

The college contingent is prepared to discuss war and education, war and morality, and congressional policies in time of war. *Associated Press*
