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ing. More than 120 students were arrested and jailed.

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"Three of them tried to stab me and two of them did stab me with bayonets," he said.

University president Ferrel Heady said the school would reopen for regular classes tomorrow. But faculty members and students, angered

by the use of guardsmen to end a three day sit-in, vowed to keep the school closed.

Maj. Gen. D. L. Doane of the New Mexico National Guard, said he would not confirm any incidents of bayoneting until a formal inquiry was held. A second Guard spokesman denied the charges.
