GIS End Cambodia Protest

Five of six U.S. 4th Division soldiers who refused to go into Cambodia with their units last week have agreed to return to their outfits, a division spokesman said yesterday.

The sixth man is reported to be receiving medical treatment for a foot ailment.

The spokesman said the headquarters at Camp Radcliffe to Plei Djereng near the border in South Vietnam's Central Highlands en route to rejoin their companies in Cambodia.

The five were identified as Specialist 4 Thomas C. Dean, 21, of Belton, S.C.; Private First Class Hugh D. Richardson, 21, of Enid, Okla.; Private First Class Danny E. Powell, 21, of Johnsonville, S.C.; Private First Class Bridgeport, Conn; and Spesamuel B. Palmer, 20, of Bridgeport, Conn; and Specialist 4 Marvie L. Youngblood, 22, of Glenwood, Ala.

The sixth soldier, Specialist 4 Carl Simmons, 19, of Philadelphia, Pa., is under medical treatment, the spokesman said. It was not known whether Simmons would be returned to his outfit.

The spokesman said the Army's informal investigation into the case would continue and that any discipliwould depend "on their conduct from here on out."
