

Commission On Campus Violence

Washington

The White House announced yesterday that President Nixon will create later this week a commission to investigate campus violence with special emphasis on the slayings of students at Kent State University and Jackson State College.

The commission, said deputy press secretary Gerald R. Warren, will be composed of prestigious members "with the ability to look with an unquestionable investigative mind at all the facts."

Herbert G. Klein, Mr. Nixon's director of communications, said Sunday that Mr. Nixon would name a commission to study the May 4 Kent State affair, but Warren said yesterday the commission's investigation will be extended to cover campus disorders in general.

The commission, Warren said, will "look into the situation on campuses and into the broad question of violence."
