

82% in Gallup Poll Opposed To Student Strikes as Protests

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PRINCETON, N. J., June 2— Eighty-two per cent of the nation's adults oppose student strikes as a way to protest "the way things are run in this country," the Gallup Poll said today.

The pollsters interviewed 1,439 persons 21 years of age and older from May 22 through May 24. They were asked, "Do you agree or disagree with college students going on strike as a way to protest the way things are run in this country?"

Of those asked, 15 per cent said they approved of such strikes and 3 per cent had no opinion.

The polltakers found that support for student strikers was greater among Negroes than among whites. It was also greater among those in their 20's than among older adults

and greater among those with a college background.
