

CHARGES SHELVED AT JACKSON STATE

JACKSON, Miss., Nov 23 —
The State of Mississippi has shelved charges against the only person indicted in connection with the violence last May 14 at Jackson State College—a Negro charged with inciting to riot and participating in a riot.

District Attorney Jack Travis has sent to the files charges against Ernest Lee Kyles, a 21-year-old former Job Corps worker from Bolton, Miss. No reason for the action was announced.

Mr. Kyles was charged on four counts by a Hinds County grand jury that conducted an investigation of the violence at Jackson State, where two students were slain and a dozen wounded after the police fired into a girls' dormitory.

The charges against Mr. Kyles grew out of the burning of a dump truck parked on a street that formerly bisected the campus. Prior to the fusillade of police gunfire, the truck was the only property that had been damaged.
