

List of Recent Major Bombing Incidents

Following is a list of some of the recent major explosions and bombing incidents in the United States before the explosion yesterday in the Capitols

1971

Jan. 7—Pomona, Calif.—A fire bomb caused \$50,000 damage to the Camp Fire Girls headquarters.

Jan. 8—Washington—A small bomb exploded outside a Soviet cultural building.

1970

Jan. 2—Morgantown, W. Va.—Bomb exploded in automobile of Monongalia County Prosecutor Joseph A. Laurita Jr., who suffered severe arm and leg injuries.

Feb. 2—Shaker Heights, Ohio—A violent explosion leveled the Municipal Building, injuring at least 14 persons, one of them critically.

Feb. 13—Berkeley, Calif.—Two bombs exploded in the Berkeley police parking lot, injuring two volunteer workers.

Feb. 14—Wrightstown, N. J.—Explosion in a coffeeshouse use as a center of antiwar activities involving soldiers at nearby Fort Dix injured three persons.

Feb. 17—San Francisco—A policeman was critically injured by a bomb in a police station with jurisdiction over the Haight-Ashbury section.

Feb. 22—New York City—Three gasoline bombs exploded in front of the home of State Supreme Court Justice John M. Murtagh, who was presiding at pretrial hearings of Black Panthers accused of conspiracy to bomb public places.

March 6—New York City—An explosion demolished

a Greenwich Village townhouse apparently used as a bomb factory and killed at least three persons.

March 9—Bel Air, Md.—Ralph E. Featherstone, a leading black militant and a close friend of H. Rap Brown, was killed in an explosion that destroyed his car and also killed a passenger.

March 12—New York City—Bombs exploded in the Socony Mobil Building, the I.B.M. Building and the General Telephone Building.

March 28—New York City—One man was killed and another critically injured in an explosion in a Lower East Side apartment where the police found bombs and bomb-making materials.

April 7—Chicago—Home-made bomb exploded in the toy section of a department store, killing a clerk and injuring eight persons.

May 1—New York City—Bombs exploded in two Bronx movie theaters, injuring 11 persons.

May 4—New York City—Bomb in a Sears, Roebuck & Co. store in Brooklyn injured two persons.

June 9—New York City—A powerful explosion at Police Headquarters caused at least seven injuries and heavy property damage.

July 7—New York City—Three persons were injured in a pipe bomb explosion at the Haitian Consulate.

July 24—Clayton, Mo.—Philip J. Lucier, president of the Continental Telephone Company, was killed when a bomb exploded in a car.

Aug. 15—Columbus, Ohio—Bombs exploded in two suburban department stores, injuring at least 16 persons.

Aug. 17—Omaha—One police-

man was killed and seven injured when a suitcase filled with explosives blew up in a vacant house.

Sept. 6—New York City—A patrolman was badly burned when a firebomb exploded under a police car.

Sept. 8—Thirty-four fire bombs went off in the Sears, Roebuck store in downtown Brooklyn.

Sept. 9—New Orleans—Spontaneous fire bombing in the wake of a police raid on Black Panthers caused an estimated \$40,000 damage to stores.

Oct. 5—Chicago—For the second time in less than a year, an explosion ripped the statue of a policeman on Haymarket Square.

Oct. 25—Washington—A bomb hidden in a package exploded on a conveyor in the main post office.

Oct. 30—New York City—Three bombs damaged two armories in Queens and the city headquarters for motorcycle policemen in the Bronx.

Nov. 1—Fresno, Calif.—Dynamite explosions damaged the Fresno Induction Center and The Fresno Guide, a conservative newspaper.

Nov. 6—Rochester—A dynamite explosion—one of a recent series—damaged a synagogue in a suburban community.

Nov. 12—Chicago—A Selective Service office was fire-bombed.

Nov. 25—New York City—A pipe bomb exploded in the doorway of the Soviet Union's airline and tourist agency.

Dec. 28—College Park, Ga.—A bomb wrapped in a paper bag exploded when a janitor picked it up in front of the Army recruiting center. The janitor was burned and cut.
