

Three Student Groups Call Protest Against War May 5

WASHINGTON, April 6 (AP) —Three of the nation's largest student organizations called today for a moratorium on high school and college campuses May 5 to protest United States involvement in Southeast Asia.

Debby Bustin, national coordinator of the Student Mobilization Committee, told a news conference: "We call on our sisters and brothers on campuses throughout this country to join with us in strikes, rallies, memorial meetings, demonstrations in a moratorium on business as usual.

"We are going to unite in one voice to say: 'This war has gone on too long. One year ago Nixon murdered American students to defend his right to murder the people of Southeast Asia. We say get the United States out of Indochina and get it out now.'"

The two other organizations were the National Student Association and the Association of Student Governments.
