It is plain the American people want no more empty promises. Nor will they settle for talk about ending U.S. ground fighting at some future date, while the escalated bombing goes on. Their opposition to the war is intensified by the growing realization of the enormous toll the war is taking at home. Funds desperately needed for homes, schools, hospitals and other social needs are drained away. Rising unemployment, runaway inflation and high taxes strike hardest at the nation's poor, especially those on welfare. And, inevi-

tably a war atmosphere bolsters the forces of racism and political repression.

As you know, nationwide demonstrations demanding "Out Now!" from Indochina and an end to the draft will be held in Washington and San Francisco on April 24. Tonight you will no doubt repeat vague promises of future peace in order to keep people home April 24th. It won't work! The American people want no more Mylais. No more invasion. No more evasions. The American people want to get out now!

That's why we will march in Washington April 24.*
