**A Call for  
Nixon to Quit  
Is Rejected**

Estes Park, Colo.

Young men and women at the White House Youth Conference yesterday rejected by almost a 2-1 margin a proposal asking for the resignation of President Nixon.

The vote on the controversial proposal was 103 to 59 among the young delegates. Adult delegates slapped down the measure even more convincingly 38-10.

The vote on the proposal was taken Monday night among delegates studying the Indochina situation. The results of the balloting were announced yesterday.

Both youth and adult delegates endorsed a measure urging the United States to establish better relations with mainland China. The proposal called for the "United States to seize every possible opportunity to promote better relations with the Peoples Republic of China, culminating in recognition and the establishment of full diplomatic relations."

Youth delegates in the Indochina study group also voted in favor of a People's peace treaty, recently circulated by groups in the United States, North and South Vietnam.

The young delegates favored the treaty by a 137-66 margin while it was narrowly rejected by adult delegates, 30-28.

Both adult and youth delegates rejected a proposal that would have supported President Nixon's present program of Vietnamization.
