

GOP Group Urges McCloskey to Quit

The United Republicans of California, one of the State's largest volunteer Republican groups, adopted a resolution yesterday urging that Representative Paul N. McCloskey Jr. resign from the GOP and give up his seat in Congress.

Delegates to the ninth annual convention of the conservative organization voted, 158 to 129, on the resolution which charged the San Mateo Congressman with "creating great internal conflict" within the party by calling for a "dialogue" concerning the impeachment of President Nixon.

Another resolution to cen-

sure the Nixon Administration for its "no-win policy in Vietnam, deficit spending and guaranteed annual income plan" was tabled following a lengthy debate. This action, in effect, killed the resolution.

Other resolutions adopted included a so-called "emergency" resolution in support of FBI Chief J. Edgar Hoover; recommendation for mining of Haiphong Harbor to cut off Hanoi's war supplies; criticism of "improper indictments and prosecution of American servicemen for war crimes and atrocities," and opposition to "recognition of or trade with Red China."
