

**5 KENT STATE SUITS
FILED IN CLEVELAND**

CLEVELAND, May 3 (UPI)—Five separate suits, seeking more than \$57-million in damages, were filed today on behalf of two Kent State University students killed by Ohio National Guardsmen and two students who were wounded.

The suits were filed "for the citizens of America" on behalf

of Arthur Krause of Pittsburgh, father of Allison Krause, one of four students of New York City, killed at Kent last May 4; Elizabeth B. Miller of New York City, mother of Jeffery G. Miller, who also was killed; Dean Kahler of East Canton, Ohio, one of nine students wounded at the university, and Joseph Lewis of Massillon, Ohio, who also was wounded.

Two suits filed in Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court

here cited the State of Ohio as defendant. Another common pleas suit cited former Gov. James A. Rhodes of Ohio; Brig. Gen. S. T. Del Corso, former Adjutant General of Ohio; Brig. Gen. Robert Canterbury, National Guard commander at Kent last year, and more than 200 guardsmen, as did one suit filed in Federal District Court. A second suit filed in Federal District Court suit also cited the guardsmen.
