An Anti-War Wedding March

Two New York teen-agers involved in anti-war demonstrations found themselves arrested and confined yesterday to a football practice field sometimes used by the Washington Redskins.

To mark the occasion, they exchanged wedding vows under one of the goal posts.

Linda Jones, 18, of Newburgh, and Bill Lyons, 19, of Staten Island were among 1200 demonstrators taken to the fenced-in field a short distance from Robert F. Kennedy Stadium.

Lyons said he and Linda had known each other for three years and had planned to marry. After being arrested, he said they decided, "The hell with it — we'll get married here."

The ceremony was conducted by the Rev. Gary Anderson, who said he was associated with the Free for All Baptist Church in Atlanta. He said the marriage will be legal as soon as the couple obtained a license.

Linda's outfit featured a knee-length navy pea jacket and bowling shoes. Lyons wore a pink sweatshirt and blue jeans. He said they planned to honeymoon in Gainesville, Fla., "But first we're going to New York to tell her mother."
