

### Clark Calls Nixon 'Lawless' In Moves on War Protests

WASHINGTON, May 23 (AP) — Ramsey Clark, the former Attorney General, said Sunday that it was "lawless" for the Nixon Administration to obtain a court order to evict antiwar veterans from the Capitol grounds during the April protests and then to refuse to enforce the order.

Mr. Clark also criticized the Administration's handling of the Mayday demonstrations in Washington, when thousands of demonstrators were rounded up in mass arrests.

"It is intolerable in a free society for the police to act in excess of the law," Mr. Clark said in a televised interview on "Face the Nation," the Columbia Broadcasting System program.

Mr. Clark denied that he was defending antiwar cases in an effort to build a constituency for the 1972 Democratic Presidential nomination.
