

### Mitchell Is Given Summary Of a Report on Kent State

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2—David L. Norman, acting head of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division, said in a letter today that he had given Attorney General John N. Mitchell a summary of a private report released last month on the Kent State shootings.

The report asserted that some National Guardsmen appeared to have conspired to shoot students during disorders at Kent State University in Ohio on May 4, 1970, in which four students were killed. The report, prepared by Peter Davies,

a New York insurance broker, put forward the theory that a group of Guardsmen had agreed to fire on the students at a prearranged signal from a sergeant.

In the letter, written to four members of the Senate Judiciary Committee, which is considering his confirmation as Assistant Attorney General in charge of civil rights, Mr. Norman added that he had sent Mr. Mitchell his recommendation on whether a grand jury should be convened. He did not say what that was.
