New Committee Asks Cease-Fire In Vietnam War

The formation of a new internationally sponsored anti-war organization calling for an immediate cease-fire by all combatants in Vietnam was announced here yesterday.

Dr. Paul Eknan, 37, a University of California Medical Center psychologist, met newsmen upon his return from Washington, D. C., where he presented an appeal on behalf of the new

United States Committee to End the Killing in Indochina.
The "International Appeal

to All Combatants," according to Eknan, is unique in

that it:

• Addresses all four parties to the war — the governments of the U.S., North and South Vietnam and the National Liberation Front — specifying actions each must take to end the killing immediately, and asks the U.S. to take the initiative.

● Makes the primary goal ending the killing now, "recognizing that Vietnamization, now or later, only means a continuation of the bloods hed, Asian rather than

American.

• "Calls for action necessary to remove the conflict from the military to the political arena..."
